#### The call came one night:

The following letter, re-printed with the permission of Herbert C. Wischow ('83), demonstrates how the bonds of brotherhood carries past the undergraduate years:

"The call came in one night. It was from a recent Alumnus from Gamma Zeta, who settled in to the New York area. He was calling on behalf of the Chapter's Alumni council, but he did not want money, he just wanted ideas on activities that would be of interest to other Alpha Sig's in the New York – New England area.

He thought that this would be a great way to strengthen the Alumni – Chapter relations, perhaps we could meet at a Baseball game or other sporting event. Events like this would help bridge the bond between brothers throughout the generations.

In our conversation I mentioned that my Dad was a charter member of Gama Zeta, and he is now resting at home after heart surgery. How about that, he replied, "We just finished the 50th anniversary video for the chapter, he might be in it. Why don't I send it to you and you can check it out? Let me know what you think of it!"

Sure enough, he called back the next day too say that the tape is on its way, Express Mail, with a pre-paid return envelope. A few short days later it was in my mailbox as promised.

I called my Dad and told him about the Alpha Sig that called, and said I would bring the video down the following weekend. As luck would have it, his VCR wasn't working, with a tape stuck in it, but I persevered and after several attempts I was able to get the old tape out and clean the machine enough to play the tape.

We sat back and watched the tape, and there he was in the photos! I could see his tired eyes light up as he traveled back in time, back to his college years. He immediately recollected the names of brothers he hasn't seen in the past half century, the founding members of the old gal on BGSU.

The video went on into the future passing by my years in 82-84, and on to the present day. I felt a link, between all the brothers of our chapter, a connection stronger than the years that have passed. A bond between the generations thanks to a brother who called me out of the blue, and sent us this tape.

A few months later, my Dad passed away to the Omega chapter. And I still think about the brother who called and sent us the video. I remember the excitement in his voice talking about it, and the happiness it brought my father on one of his few Sunday afternoons left on this earth.
