Yesterday I received a replica of the original Gamma Zeta chapter charter from Brother Kevin Kovecny. Thanks so much Kevin for your thoughtfulness. It nearly brought tears to my eyes, and it is something that I will always treasure.

In all, 48 names of founding brothers appear on this document dated June 3, 1950. While I was not initiated until two years later, I had the privilege of knowing a good number of these brothers at least for brief periods. William A Cameron, with whom many of us today know and love is on the list. Gerald Mark Brown, who passed on the Omega Chapter many years ago and was my big brother, is also on the list.

I suspect that many of the brothers, both alumni and active, don't realize that of these 48, a majority were veterans of World War II and had recently returned to validate their G.I. Bill rights at Bowling Green. Our chapter was largely founded by these brave brothers who had fought for our country. Some were decorated heroes of that awful war. As far as I am concerned, they are all heroes even today.

It is important that the entire Gamma Zeta brotherhood be keenly aware that the founding of our chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi is steeped in Americanism, by brothers who committed their very lives to the protection of the freedom and liberties so valued by this nation. That is a heritage that each and every one of us and all future brothers, can and should be proud of.

The brotherhood also raised close to \$600 for charitable organizations and had over 550 hours of community service. In the world of Dr. Victor J. Boschini Jr., it is just 18 years from serving as the House Director for Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity at Bowling Green State University to the presidency of a major American university. His path has included time as a Greek Advisor, leadership in the Association of Fraternity Advisors (including a term as president), teaching, several administrative positions, Associate Provost, and as Vice President for Student Affairs. In 1997, Dr. Boschini was named President of Illinois State University, and this summer he assumed the role as Chancellor of Texas Christian University.

With this in mind, Greek Affairs at Bowling Green State University is proud to name Dr. Victor J. Boschini Jr. as the second recipient of the Spirit of GreekBGSU Award in recognition of his leadership and achievement within Higher Education, and his long-time support of fraternities and sororities on college campuses. Vic has taken the experiences and lessons learned as a graduate student in College Student Personnel, and a graduate assistant within Greek Affairs at Bowling Green State University to the highest level in his profession.

Dr. Boschini received his Bachelor's Degree from Mount Union College, and his doctorate in Higher Education Administration from Indiana University. After completing his Master's Degree in College Student Personnel at BGSU in 1979, Vic worked in a variety of Student Affairs positions at Indiana University, Butler University, and Illinois State University. He has also taught in the College of Education at all three institutions.

A member of Sigma Nu fraternity, Vic has been actively involved with the Association of Fraternity Advisors. Following a series of leadership positions, he served as President of the Association.

Joe Zimmerman, a member of Alpha Sigma Phi when Vic was the House Director said, "I recall from my under-graduate days living in the Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity House, what a gift Vic had for supporting students and making them feel welcome to come to him for help. With an upbeat, energetic and positive attitude, Vic encouraged and motivated us to succeed. He had a facility for writing and often helped me to get my research papers started. When I recently reviewed his acceptance speech on the TCU web site I took delight in seeing that it is a gift that he has not lost. Congratulations Vic and thanks for the support you provided to the Fraternity some 25 years ago!"
